Avoid areas prone to frost and soils that have previously grown potatoes, chrysanthemums, or tomatoes because they are all prone to the disease verticillium wilt. Growing Strawberries In Minnesota

Strawberries are tolerant of different soil types, although they prefer loam. Ideally, begin working in aged manure or compost a couple months before planting. If you have clay soil, generally mix in 4 inches or more of compost, and rake the clay soil into raised mounds to further improve drainage. If your soil is sandy, simply cultivate to remove weeds, and mix in a 1-inch layer of rich compost or rotted manure.

Fruit breeding at the University of Minnesota has been ongoing since 1878, when the state legislature appropriated \$2,000 to purchase a tract of land near Lake Minnetonka at Excelsior as an experiment station and \$1,000 per year for operations.

Creating the Right Growing Conditions 1 Use raised beds to grow a large number of strawberries. Bare root strawberries need to be planted 12–18 inches (30–46 cm) apart, and a raised bed will give you plenty of space for multiple plants.

Strawberries grow well in a variety of zones (2-11). While they thrive in warm weather, these perennials easily survive the winter, with plants spreading each year they return. Plant strawberries in sandy, loamy soil with a pH between 5.0-7.0. Soil should drain well and not become waterlogged after rain.
